## 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

**Emergency overview** Harmful in contact with eyes. Danger of serious damage to health by prolonged exposure. May cause cancer. May cause breathing disorders and lung damage.

### Potential short term health effects

<b>Eyes</b>	Contact may irritate or burn eyes. Eye contact may result in corneal injury.
<b>Skin</b>	Components of the product may be absorbed into the body through the skin.
<b>Inhalation</b>	May cause breathing disorders and lung damage.
<b>Ingestion</b>	Do not ingest.
<b>Target organs</b>	Eyes. Lungs. Respiratory system. Skin.

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### First aid

<b>Eye contact</b>	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 20 minutes. Get medical attention immediately. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.
<b>Skin contact</b>	Get medical attention immediately. Remove and isolate contaminated clothing and shoes. Immediately flush skin with running water for at least 20 minutes. For minor skin contact, avoid spreading material on unaffected skin. Wash off immediately with plenty of water. If skin irritation persists, call a physician.
<b>Inhalation</b>	Get medical attention immediately. Move to fresh air. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim inhaled the substance. Induce artificial respiration with the aid of a pocket mask equipped with a one-way valve or other proper respiratory medical device. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention, if needed.
<b>Ingestion</b>	If material is ingested, immediately contact a physician or poison control center. Do not induce vomiting without medical advice. If vomiting occurs naturally, have victim lean forward to reduce risk of aspiration. Induce artificial respiration with the aid of a pocket mask equipped with a one-way valve or other proper respiratory medical device. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim ingested the substance.
<b>Notes to physician</b>	Symptoms may be delayed.
<b>General advice</b>	Keep victim warm. Keep victim under observation. In case of shortness of breath, give oxygen. Ensure that medical personnel are aware of the material(s) involved, and take precautions to protect themselves.

## 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

<b>Suitable extinguishing media</b>	Small Fires: Dry chemical, CO2, water spray or regular foam.  Large Fires: Water spray, fog or regular foam.
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<b>Fire fighting equipment/instructions</b>	Move containers from fire area if you can do it without risk. Do not scatter spilled material with high pressure water streams. Withdraw immediately in case of rising sound from venting safety devices or any discoloration of tanks due to fire. ALWAYS stay away from tanks engulfed in flame. If tank, rail car or tank truck is involved in a fire, ISOLATE for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions; also consider initial evacuation for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

<b>Evacuation procedures</b>	Stay upwind. Keep out of low areas. Keep unnecessary personnel away.
<b>Containment procedures</b>	Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Prevent entry into waterways, sewers, basements or confined areas.
<b>Personal precautions</b>	Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak.
<b>Methods for cleaning up</b>	Absorb with earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to containers for later disposal. Dike far ahead of liquid spill for later disposal. Never return spills in original containers for re-use.

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

<b>Handling</b>	Do not breathe gas/fumes/vapor/spray. Wear personal protective equipment. Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Surfaces may become slippery after spillage.
<b>Storage</b>	Keep container tightly closed. Keep out of the reach of children. Keep in a cool, well-ventilated place. This material can accumulate static charge which may cause spark and become an ignition source. Prevent electrostatic charge build-up by using common bonding and grounding techniques. Do not freeze.
